He also carried out country strategy work for IFAD on the formerly centrally-planned economies of Eastern- and Central Europe. In 1994 he became the **Lead Economist** in the Office of the Assistant President of the Programme Management Department. In June 2004 up to date he has become the **Director of IFAD's Asia and Pacific Division**
